First Lady applauds Makerere training

First Lady Mrs. Janet Museveni has welcomed Makerere University's Skills, Production, and Enterprise Development Excellency (SPEDA) programme training model and prayed for its success in Ruhaama.

Mrs. Janet Museveni, who is the MP for Ruhaama and Minister for Karamoja Affairs, was addressing the people of Rukoni parish after attending a sensitisation meeting on the AFRISA-SPEDA training model by Makerere University academicians who she invited to her constituency to impart skills in production, value addition, job creation, employment, business development and sustainable marketing to the people for wealth creation in their families and social development.

The sensitisation meeting was held at Kyentama Primary School ground in Rukoni parish, Rukoni West sub-county on Saturday.

Mrs. Museveni said the AFRISA-SPEDA training programme for Ruhaama will start from Rukoni parish whose people have exhibited hard work in production activities and it will thereafter spread to other areas. The people of Rukoni parish grow matooke on a large scale.

Mrs. Museveni said the SPEDA training is an investment that will benefit even their offspring and encouraged the people

in partnership with the Government to promote appropriate skills, technology and community service and is a platform for engaging the academia, community, the Government and private sector as partners in development.
